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

THE POWER OF SUNDAY SCHOOL

I will never forget that walk. I can't tell you the exact day or even the year, but the place was West Monroe Baptist Church. The occasion was the Union Baptist sponsored Sunday Association School Revival. A man from Illinois that was referred to as the "Sunday School Man" was holding a weeklong meeting to help our UBA churches in their Sunday school work. That man was Leon Kilbreth and he would become one of my heroes of faith and a long distance mentor.

I could not believe what I read about this "Sunday School Man". He wasn't a pastor, evangelist or missionary but a Sunday school director and later a minister of Education. He was a layman sold out to God. It was reported that in his home church he led the Sunday school to the rare Sunday "Standard School Award" for several years, an accomplishment achieved by less than 10 churches in the convention

IEvidently, in the town of Energy, the location of his home church, his Sunday school had enrolled all but a dozen or fewer of the town's citizens. I found out that he had written a book on soul winning, which my children received copies signed by Leon years later.

As a new Sunday school director, I was awestruck. All week I had sat in that meeting and felt God opening my eyes and heart to the work He was calling me to join.

You see, I had just been elected by MEBC to serve as Sunday School Director. Someone who does not know our God would say it was by chance that I was there, but we know God was at work preparing me, and the church, for this meeting long before.

It all started with my attempt to resign from the teacher assistant role. I was nominated to assist Larry Knight with a children's Sunday class. I was beyond terrible! The kids were bored and restless when I taught. They obviously didn't want to learn from me, and I didn't want to teach. So, I went by Preacher Mickey's office and told him I needed to resign. We talked for a few minutes; he was very encouraging. He asked me to give it time; I'm sure he realized I wasn't really putting in much effort. He was very kind, but what he put in my hands that day was providential.

The Sunday School director had been receiving a magazine from the Southern Baptist Sunday School Board each month and there were several months of back copies in the Pastor's office. Preacher Mickey handed me that stack of "Sunday School Leader" magazines and said, "Read through these, and see if you can find some tips about teaching Children Sunday School."

I started that day thumbing through those magazines and was amazed at the God-sized scope of the Sunday school ministry. I had never realized that "Sunday School" was more than a Bible study.

I was learning that these "open" small groups are beneficial for the church to achieve the Lord's commission.

The Southern Baptist, like no other denomination, had used the Sunday school ministry to to the largest grow America. denomination in Suddenly, I began to see the big picture and why we do what we do. I saw how we could use the strategies from these articles to do things better. I mentioned all this to the Preacher and asked him a ton of questions. He gave me a couple of books on Sunday school work and we had many more discussions.

That next September, I was surprised to be asked by the nominating committee to consider the Sunday school director position for the new church year. I found myself a newly elected Sunday School director, who about a year prior was a failed assistant children's teacher ready to quit, sitting in a "Sunday School Revival" led by the best Sunday School man since Arthur Flake. I'll admit I didn't really know what to expect. I had never even heard of a Sunday School Revival. After the first night, I knew that this was a special meeting. Leon taught us about how to use Sunday school to organize the church for growth in more than just numbers, and he taught us why numbers matter. He showed us that Sunday school is much more than a program to maintain, but a ministry and strategy to use for Kingdom work. Leon's examples and statistics caused me and many others to shift our focus outward rather than inward. I

He challenged the church leaders to prioritize the Sunday school ministry then watch as all of the other ministries flourish as the church was strengthened. This was the beginning of my call to the Sunday school ministry. I have said, and with a sincere heart I will say it again, if I ever find another ministry more effective and blessed by God to equip, organize and employ all followers for Great commission work, I will embrace it as fully as I have Sunday school for these many years. I have not. I am certain in my soul that no one has. If you want to be a part of this ministry and really see what God can do through the Church organized and equipped, come be a part of this ministry. It is so much more than those 45 minutes on Sunday morning!

Oh, and that walk?

On the last night of the Sunday school revival Leon the Sunday school man spoke directly to the Sunday school directors, "Will you walk down this aisle to join your Pastor?" the Pastors had come forward and committed to God in the SS ministry, "Take your Pastor by the hand and tell him however God leads in the Sunday School work, I will support you and will do all I can to fulfill my responsibilities the SS as director. By doing this you are committing yourself to God in this ministry".

My life changed that night as I walked to take my Pastor's hand and commit myself to this call on my life. Leon was right, **God** is in this work!

My prayer is that someone will find themself walking that walk of dedication to the Sunday School ministry as I did those many years ago. "Lord, please call out a great Sunday school leader from our midst. Amen."
